ORDER:-

In the letter first and second read above, the State Level Sanctioning Committee and Government of India have approved the Annual Action Plan of National Bamboo Mission for an outlay of of Rs.166.15 lakh (Government of India share of Rs.99.69 lakh and State Share of Rs.66.46 lakh) under Krishonnati Yojana (KY) for the Financial Year 2026-2027.

2. In the letter third read above, Government of India has released the amount of Rs.39,88,000/- as a drawing limit in the form of Mother Sanction during the Financial Year 2026-27 under General, SCSP & TSP Categories for the implementation of National Bamboo Mission through SNA SPARSH module. The details of mother sanction released by the GOI and the matching state share to be released are tabulated as below:-

In the letter fourth read above, the Director of Horticulture & Plantation Crops has requested the Government to accord Administrative Sanction for the total approved AAP amount of Rs.166.15 lakh (Government of India share of Rs.99.69 lakh and State Share of Rs.66.46 lakh) and Financial Sanction for an amount of Rs.66,46,667/- as first instalment which includes Government of India Share of Rs.39,88,000/- and state matching share of Rs.26,58,667/- to incur expenditure towards implementation of National Bamboo Mission under Krishnannati Yojana for executing the Annual Action Plan 2026-27 through SNA SPARSH module.

4. After careful examination of the proposal of the Director of Horticulture & Plantation Crops, the Government hereby accord the Administrative Sanction for the total amount of Rs.166.15 lakh (Rupees One Crore Sixty Six lakh and fifteen thousand only) and Financial Sanction for an amount of **Rs.66,46,667/- (Rupees Sixty Six lakh Forty Six thousand and Six Hundred Sixty Seven only)** as first instalment which includes Government of India Share of Rs.39,88,000/- (Rupees Thirty Nine Lakh and Eighty Eight thousand only) and state matching share of Rs.26,58,667/- (Rupees Twenty Six Lakh Fifty Eight thousand Six Hundred and Sixty Seven only) towards implementation of National Bamboo Mission under Krishnannati Yojana for executing the Annual Action Plan 2026-27.

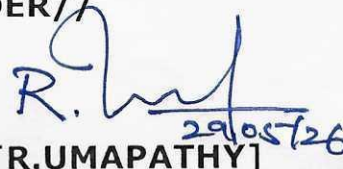

Annexure – II

Implementation Guidelines

- Objective-The component primarily aims at expansion of area under Bamboo Plantations in Government lands and Private Farm lands with irrigation facilities. The main objective is to increase production and productivity of commercially important Bamboo species for boosting Domestic supply to Industry and reduce dependance on Imports.
- 100% of cost to Government sector. 50% of cost to private sector to the maximum of 2 ha per beneficiary.
- The beneficiary should be selected and registered in TN HORTNET portal.
- For above 10 Ha, no subsidy will be provided.

A.1&2. Block or Boundary Plantations- Bamboo Cultivation in Non-Forest Lands:

Public Land - 100% subsidy of Rs.1.20 lakh/Ha over 2 years in the ratio (60:40) Rs.72,000/- for 1st year

Private Land - 50% cost of Rs.1.20 lakh/Ha over 2 years in the ratio (60:40) Rs.36,000/- for 1st year

- Spacing - 5*5m
- Expected number of Plants/Ha 375-450 Plants.
- It should be ensured that certified planting material of desired species is provided to Farmers along with proper agronomic practices so as to maximise overall returns from Bamboo and other intercrops.
- Photographs during planting should be enclosed along with 1 year beneficiary application.
- Commercially important Bamboo species recommended are Bambusa balcooa, B.bambos, B.tulda, B.cacharensis, B.polymorpha, B.nutans, Dendracalamus strictus, D.asper, D.hamiltonii, Thyrostachys oliverii & Melocanna baccifera and any other species based on the Farmer's preference, prevailing climate type, industrial importance, opportunities for Value addition and Marketing.
- Photographs of established bamboo plants along with Survival reports have to be submitted before claiming 2nd year maintenance.

- Maintenance support in subsequent years will be linked to survival rates, with a minimum of 80% survival with replacement of deceased saplings for eligibility of full subsidy. Pro-rata maintenance subsidy may be given for survival rates above 50%, with the condition for replanting. (Number of saplings planted and survived).
- Geo tagging of all components and field level demonstration have to be done through Krishi mapper mandatorily.

B.1 Second year Maintenance (Private):

Plantations raised in Private Land during 2025-26 at 50% cost of Rs.1.20 lakh/Ha over 2 years in the ratio (60:40) i.e., Rs.24,000/- for 2nd year maintenance.

C. Pending Liability:

District officers should release the funds that were marked as pending.

General Instructions

- Irrigating bamboo plantations, especially during summer, is essential for better yield. Assistance for micro-irrigation and fertigation for plantations under NBM can be availed under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) - Per Drop More Crop scheme.
- Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) will be an integral part of implementation, focusing on both programme physical/financial achievements and socio-economic and environmental impacts.
- At District level, a District level Agency should be formed constituting the officials from Industries, Horticulture, Forest, Rural Development, Cooperatives, SHGs, NGOs.
- Third party evaluation must ensure participation & feedback from the Farmers, Farmer Groups, Artisans, Women, etc.,
- The achievement and the beneficiary details should be uploaded in the MIS login in NMSA portal.
- Proper documentation with photographs and entry in necessary registers should be maintained at Block level for inspection at any time with details like yearwise, beneficiary wise new plantations established area, survival % and subsidy extended including maintenance cost etc., along with photographs.
- District level officers should inspect and record the survival % and also should maintain necessary documents / registers pertaining to this scheme.
- Survival % should be strictly ensured by block officers viz AHO/AAO/HO/ADH by selecting land with proper irrigation facilities or by providing drip Irrigation facilities.

- Preference can be given to Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs), Farmer Producer Companies (FPCs), Cooperatives, Village Producer Organisations (VPOs), Self Help Groups (SHGs) and the like.
- Geo tagging of all components and field level demonstration have to be done through Krishi mapper mandatorily.
- Physical and Financial progress should be submitted to this office within the 5th of every month.
