ORDER:

In the letter first read above, the State Level Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) has approved the Annual Action Plan under National Mission on Edible Oils - Oil Palm (NMEO-OP) 2026-2027 for Rs.208.74 lakh.

2. In the letter second read above, the Government of India has restricted the area under 3rd year maintenance of Oil Palm Plantation and

approved the Annual Action Plan for Rs.204.72 lakh under Krishonnati Yojana (KY) National Mission on Edible Oils – Oil Palm 2026-27.

3. In the letter third read above, the Government of India have released an amount of Rs.61.42 lakh as central share in the form of mother sanction under three categories General, Schedule Caste Sub Plan & Tribal Sub Plan for implementation of NMEO - Oil Palm through SNA SPARSH module during the year 2026-27.

4. In the letter fourth read above, the Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops has requested the Government to accord Administrative Sanction for an amount of Rs.204.72 lakh and financial sanction for a sum of Rs.102.36667 lakh including Government of India Share of Rs.61.42 lakh and State Matching Share of Rs.40.94667 lakh as first installment for implementing the National Mission on Edible Oils – Oil Palm 2026-27 as detailed below:-

The Government after careful examination accept the proposal of Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops and accord Administrative sanction for an amount of Rs.204.72 lakh and financial sanction for a sum of Rs.102.36667 lakh including Government of India Share of Rs.61.42 lakh and State Matching Share of Rs.40.94667 lakh as first installment towards the implementation of National Mission on Edible Oils- Oil Palm(NMEO-OP) as detailed in the Annexure - I through SNA SPARSH platform during the year 2026-2027.

The Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops is directed to scrupulously follow the guidelines annexed to this order in Annexure II and the National Mission on Edible Oils - Oil Palm broader guidelines issued by the Government of India and to follow the cost norms and pattern of assistance while implementing the mission and terms and conditions stipulated in the Government of India letter third read above while implementing the scheme of National Mission on Edible Oils- Oil Palm.

As the expenditure is to be incurred through various drawals as and when expenditure is incurred, by various Drawing and Disbursing Officers mapped under the scheme, the Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops is directed to ensure that the overall expenditure based on this G.O. does not exceed the sanctioned amount in the G.O. by all the Drawing and Disbursing Officers mapped under the scheme.

11. The Director of Horticulture and Plantation Crops is directed to strictly adhere to the SNA-SPARSH guidelines issued in Government Letter No.573, Finance (PFMS) dated 06.01.2025.

ANNEXURE-II

National Mission on Edible Oils -Oil Palm (NMEO-OP)
Implementation Guidelines-2026-27

I. Area Expansion - Supply of Planting Materials:

1. Subsidy for the planting material is Rs.20,000/- per Ha for indigenous and Rs.29,000/- per Ha for Imported planting material (including transport cost)
2. **150 Nos.** of seedlings should be distributed per Ha.
3. Planting material will be supplied through allotted Oil Palm firms to selected beneficiaries. The firms are allotted to the districts mentioned against them to supply the Oil palm seedlings to the farmers as attached herewith.
4. The Block officers should ensure that 12 to 15 months old seedlings are supplied and planted in the farmers' field by the concerned firms.
5. Photographs during and after planting should be enclosed along with beneficiary application along with latitude and longitude.
6. In order to prevent rodent damage, wire mesh should be used in the newly planted area.
7. The subsidy amount for the supplied planting material has to be released to concerned firms through ECS.
8. Proper documentation of the field with necessary registers should be maintained.

II. Maintenance cost during gestation period:

Assistance for maintenance during the gestation Period of four years is provided to the farmers @ 50% of the cost limited to Rs. 5,250/ Ha per year from the 1st year itself.

III. Inputs for intercropping with Oil Palm Fields during gestation period:

Assistance with regard to inputs for intercropping with Oil Palm fields during gestation period is provided for four years @ 50% of the cost is limited to Rs. 5,250/ Ha per year.

During gestation period of 4 years, in total Rs.42,000 / Ha (maintenance & intercropping) is provided to the farmers in total.

The cost of maintenance and intercropping involves the following items:

1. **Fertilizers, Organic Manure & Pesticides:** Fertilizers, Fertilizer application, Organic Manure, Manure Application, Plant Protection, PP application, etc.,
2. **Other costs:** Land preparation, Layout, Pitting, Planting, Basin preparation, Weed Management, Repair and Maintenance and Miscellaneous expenses, etc.,

IV. Machineries and tools:

1. Support will be provided for the purchase of equipment / tools up to 50% of the cost and are limited to the amount as below.

2. **Source of procurement:** AED empanelment - Approved manufacturer/ dealers.

3. In case, if the above mentioned equipments/tools are not listed in AED empanelment, farmers can purchase those tools themselves and the amount can be released as back ended subsidy through ECS.

V. Project Management Expenses (PME): 1% of total allocation under NMEO-Oil Palm will be provided for engaging state/district level consultant/Technical assistant and DEO'S.

Flexi fund component- Production incentive for Oil Palm FFBs:

1. Oil Palm growers who get an yield of Fresh Fruit Bunches (FFBs) above 8 Mt/ha from 5-year-old and above plantation are eligible to avail production incentives for oil palm Fresh Fruit Bunches.
2. For every ton above 8MT/Ha, production incentive of Rs.1000/MT will be given to the grower.
3. Flexi funds should be provided to farmers only on submission of yield certificate from the procuring company, collection centre/factory.

General Instructions:

1. Necessary publications and Awareness creation should be given among the farmers. Beneficiary registration should be only through TNHORTNET online portal. Farmer's ID generated in Farmers Registry should be documented.
2. The Block officers should ensure assured irrigation facility of the farmer's field and convergence with PDMC-Micro irrigation scheme should be done.

3. Technical assistance by the block officials at the field level should be provided to the farmers.
4. By the end of the year, a register with beneficiary wise/ component wise subsidy extended details along with photo documents should be maintained at block level and should be shown to the monitoring/Zonal officer of the respective district when reviewed.
5. Field verification should be carried out by the ADH/HO/AAOs/AHOs to ensure the survival of maximum number of trees in the field.
6. The Block Officers should verify whether proper crop distance has been maintained (The intercrop should not compete with main crop)
7. Required seeds for intercropping should be procured from Government sources.
8. The selection of intercrops in oil palm such as Cocoa, Red Ginger, Bush Pepper, Banana, Vegetables and Ornamental Crops would be farmers choice and area specific.
9. The required fertilizers should be purchased by farmers from PACCS/Other sources.
10. Farmers should enclose the bills for the fertilizers purchased along with application. AAOs / AHOs should recommend it to the ADH through HO / Deputy HO for disbursing the cash component of the subsidy through ECS as back ended subsidy.
11. The back ended subsidy amount has to be disbursed to the farmers to assist during gestation period. Registers should be maintained with the details on year wise, farmer wise, new plantation taken up, survival and maintenance subsidy extended etc., at block level.
12. District level officials should also inspect and record the survival of trees during their inspection.

13. Department should involve NDDDB and other Co-operatives for oil palm development.

14. Geo tagging of all assets created and Oil Palm plantations developed have to be done through Krishi mapper mandatorily.
